As part of the GALEO Institute for Leadership, we have formed a strategic partnership with the University of Georgia's **Fanning Institute** to expand and develop our joint efforts for the Community Leadership Program. Founded in 1982, the Fanning Institute is named for Vice President and Professor Emeritus J.W. Fanning, whom many consider to be the "father of leadership" in Georgia. His leadership and community development legacy is carried on today through the Fanning Institute's continued vision of building community capacity.

Community Leadership Program:

It has been said that leadership is the prime force that makes positive things happen in a community. A primary goal of the Fanning Institute's Community Leadership Program (CLP) is the development of knowledgeable, skilled, committed, and action-oriented leaders. This involves bringing people together with diverse backgrounds and varying perspectives to enhance their leadership skills.
